Dave has been Wolves regular centre- half now for many seasons and has to date made two hundred and twenty five appearances in the Wolves colours. He is a very consistant player and is often rated the best player on the field by many people.

'Duggie' is married and his one son and his wife hardly fail to miss a game. He is recognized as one of the fitest players in the side because of his extra training stints and long walks.

Dave did have a run of games at centre-forward in the first season in Division 2 and although he scored a few goals he reverted back to his favourite position.

He is a fine clubman, strong tackler and very good in the air. He is well liked by the Molineux crowd because of his calmness and safeness when the defence is under pressure and is often called the backbone of the defence

MATCH REPORTS.

At last Wolves have settled down to play some consistant football in fact the best they have played since their return to the First Division.

The defence is playing better than ever and with great confidence possibly because Parkes is playing so well in goal. In the last twelve games only nine goals have been conceded (up to and including Chelsea away).

Wolves v West Ham (Molineux November 9th)

Wolves went straight into the attack determined to get a win at home. West Ham were soon shattered. Farrington scoredeasily after Dougan's shot was palmed out by Fergeson and not long after Bailey scored another. This was a typical Bailey goal he received the ball and hit it on the run from well outside the area leaving the keeper no chance. Wolves eased off the pressure and left the field with a comfortable lead at half-time.

H.T. Wolves 2 West Ham 0

Wolves went out for more goals but were unable to increase their lead. They decided to play steadily, satisfied with a two nil win but allowing West Ham to attack could have been fatal but the nearest they came was a Peter's shot that hit the post with only a few minutes left.

Wolves v Burnley (Turf Moor November 16th)

Burnley took the field, with a club record of eight wins in a row behind them, against a weakened Wolves side. Mike Bailey was injured and was replaced by Frank Wignall playing in the unfamilar No. 4 shirt.

Wolves should have taken the lead straight from kickoff when a brilliant move ended with Wignall hitting the
bar. Burnley took an undeserved lead when a shot was
prodded between the Wolves defenders. Wolves hit back
hard though and were rewarded when Dougan headed a
magnificant goal from twelve yards out.

Wolves were under constant pressure for the rest of the game and a brilliant defence held firm with Parkes playing well. But in fact Wolves could have left the field with both points after two clear cut chances should have found the net.

Wolves v Newcastle (Molineux November 23rd)

Wolves could well have reached double figures for some bad luck. Knowles gave Wolves the lead, after his first shot was saved he hit home the rebound. Wignall got the second with a great volley which nearly broke the back of the net and Dougan out-jumped the keeper to head the third straight after half-time.

Wolves were putting up a great display in front of their new manager, Bill McGarry, who must have surely been impressed especially when they went four up when Knowles scored a truly great goal with a spectacular overhead kick. It was soon evident that Wolves were scoring at will and 'Doog' added to the scoreline with a shot into the roof of the net.

Parkes played splendidly, although the score might suggest he was untroubled, in the first twenty minutes

he made two remarkable saves from Newcastle leader, Wyn Davies, who always looked menacing.

Wolves played brilliantly in the second half and but for Pat Jennings and some illfortune they only scored two but what great goals they were.

Derek Dougan, having such a fine season, hammered in Wignall's headed cross from close in and with the crowd rearing Welves on Wignall fastened onto Dougan's pass, ran a good thirty yards and hammered in an unst pable shot.

This completed the scoring in a fine game.

Wolves v Chelsea (Stamford Bridge December 14th)

This was Wolves first visit to London and a game which most of the L.S.C. attended. An icy pitch played havoc to the players and Wolves were content to defend and take a point.

Wolves were breaking quickly and Knowles was unlucky with a fine header with Bonetti saving brilliantly but they took the lead when Kenning blasted home a penalty after Frank Wignall was fouled.

Only two minutes later Chelsea had a penalty but Osgood's kick was saved by Boswell who had a great game and really showed for the first time why Wolves paid £20,000 for him.

Wolves looked like taking both points but Chelsea were awarded another penalty in the last minute and Osgood equalized Boswell, Parkin and Hotgrove were stalwart in defence and again Dougan was as menacing as ever.

MR. JACK HOWLEY.

Jack Howley, General Manager of Wolverhampton Wanderers, has announced his retirement after 45 years service with the club.

Mr. Howley joined Wolves as an Office junior in 1923 and has worked his way up from the bottom to his position now as General Manager. He has held this job for the last five years, and for twenty years before that he was secretary of the club.

Mr. Howley has had a lot to do with the formation of our own London Supporters Club. It was he who first invited 15 of us, who travelled regularly to the games, into his Office for discussion on how to get cheaper travel. This was in September 1966 and this meeting was in fact the start of the L.S.C.

A coach trip was organized a fortnight later to a home game and from then on coaches have been run regularly since. Mr. Howley arranged for us to obtain free admission and also other privileges such as meeting the players and availability of tickets if needed.

We wish to convey our thanks to Mr. Howley for all he has done. We are sure that the L.S.C. would not be in the position that it is today if it had not been for his great help and we wish him many years of happiness in his retirement.
